Stiperstones – Flo- for having lots of enthusiasm for all our learning and for contributing your thought and opinions lots in lessons. Well done!

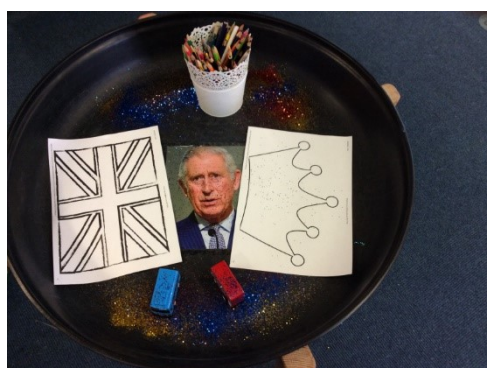
Class News

We enjoyed a spring walk, counting all of the flowers and recognising shape and colour along the way.

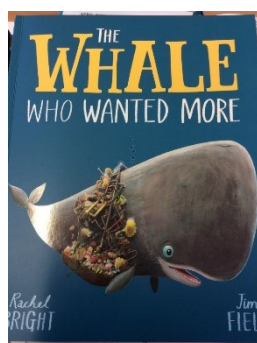
Our Kate Burton Maths programme for this half term is, 'Inside out number fun' so we have been busy recognising numerals throughout the indoor/outdoor environment.

What a busy time! We hope you enjoy continuing in the celebrations over the coming days and look forward to hearing all about it when we return next week.





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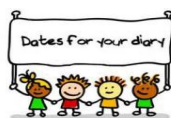
