#### RSE in schools

"Relationships and sex education" is teaching pupils about healthy, respectful relationships, focussing on family and friendships, in all contexts, including online. From September 2020, Relationships and Health Education became statutory in primary schools and Relationships, Sex and Health Education became statutory in secondary schools. 'When children are comfortable talking about relationships and sex education, it has a very positive impact on their life. Good quality conversations about RSE help to keep children safe, improves their communication, increases everyone's understanding of relationships and improves their self-esteem and confidence.'

During EYFS, key stage 1 and key stage 2 children will learn about:

- Families and people who care for us
- Caring friendships
- Respectful relationships
- Online relationships
- Staying safe

#### Year 5 and 6

As part of our Relationship and Sex Education over the next half term we will be delivering work based on the topic of growing and changing, looking at puberty and conception. To deliver this we use a combination of resources from NSPCC 'Speak out, stay safe' and the 1Decision Program of Study. By the end of this unit children should be able to:

- Explain what puberty means.
- Describe the changes that boys and girls may go through during puberty.
- Identify why our bodies go through puberty.
- Develop coping strategies to help with different stages of puberty.
- Identify who can help us with puberty.
- Describe the function of the male and female reproductive systems.
- Explain the terms 'conception' and 'reproduction'.
- Identify the various ways adults can have a child.
- Explain various stages of pregnancy.
- Identify the laws around consent.
